## What and where:

Thank you for your interest in helping. As you know, Españolandia is the simulation of a country and we need many volunteers. This year we expect about 2,500 middle and high school students. It is in room 3220 to 3228 WSC in the Wilkinson Center on Thursday, April 18.

You need to be at **B-152 JFSB at 7 am**, where Dr. Bateman will give you a box to bring to the WSC, where I will be. We have only 1 hour to set up everything since the students come at 8 am.

The activity lasts until noon and we will invite you to eat lunch after the cleanup.

## **Dress code:**

If you have a **costume or clothing from a Spanish-speaking country**, you might want to wear it; soccer jerseys, or t-shirts with phrases in Spanish are also great.

Please don't wear shirts with names in English

If possible, try to match the station you signed for (ie., if you signed up for the bank, try to dress up (shirt and tie, if possible) so we can look more like a banker ☺). We have some uniform jackets for customs officers and policemen.

## Important:

Please don't speak English with students.

They need to obtain 7 stamps in their passports to leave Españolandia. Help them to earn their stamps. Study the conversation of your post since students expect that you will ask them what they have study (we'll have those in the boxes at your stations.) If there is a big line of students waiting, maintain a short conversation with them so they can earn their stamp. However, if you are not too busy, feel free to carry on the conversation and ask them about their family, school, likes, etc.

Help them understand you by using gestures, option such as this or that sentences (ie., Do you like reading (gesture for book) or watching movies (gesture for watch)?) and facial expressions.
